Strengthening Vaccine Confidence: A Global Public Health Imperative

Vaccine hesitancy is one of the most consequential threats to public health today. Despite safe, effective vaccines against a growing range of preventable diseases, uptake remains dangerously uneven across regions, income groups and communities. The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated misinformation and eroded institutional trust at scale. Rebuilding confidence demands evidence-based communication, sustained community engagement and genuine political commitment—from global bodies down to local health authorities.

This World Leadership Dialogue convenes leaders from different regions to examine what works, what fails and what must change. The session will interrogate how cultural, political and health-system contexts shape hesitancy, which communication strategies have succeeded, and which have backfired, and what policy levers governments can activate to protect immunisation coverage.
